Yacht Market Overview

Only one year after the substantial downturn in the market, the tail end of 2009 brought about a steady increase in industry turnover for certain sizes of yacht, both motor and sail. The process of matching buyers and sellers was now proving to be a more detailed and sophisticated procedure and the market itself was still adapting to the new economic climate.

With a more optimistic outlook for the industry compared to 12 months earlier, the transition period from 2009 to 2010 saw the predominantly buyer's market flooded with boats with owners reluctantly selling for much lower than asking prices. Thanks to buyers wanting to cash in on remaining attractive opportunities before the summer, market turnover remained consistently strong only 18 months after the original downturn.

The last few months have seen an increased level of business with buyers adopting a more cautious approach than two years earlier. The aggressive marketplace continued to prosper in 2010 well into the start of the notoriously quiet summer period, with sales in all areas continuing to grow, a surprising contrast to the situation only 12 months earlier.

What 2011 holds for the yachting industry is difficult to say, but we think there will be a steady increase in sales and charters between now and next summer. The behaviour of sales of sailing vessels will remain more consistent than the motor boat market but the transition between 2010 and

2011 could prove to be a promising period with the market starting to settle further increasing buyers' confidence which can only be interpreted as a good thing.

For BGYB, the period between 2009 and 2010 has seen solid growth in a number of areas.

With the establishment of an office in Granada, headed by Richard Syjzan, the company has been able to increase its representation around the world with highly experienced personnel at a time when the yachting industry is fairly stagnant. A presence in the Caribbean will enable the company to establish itself in an important area of business within the yachting world, something that will benefit our customers enormously. BGYB has also seen a noticeable increase in number, size and quality of its centrally listed yachts.

The company has also witnessed solid growth in both management and charter business.

The management side of the business has taken a significant step forward through Guillaume Gosse joining us and enabling us to benefit from his large experience as a previous director of a large cargo fleet management company.

This has been matched by our consistently growing charter business. In a difficult time for the charter industry with customers less willing to spend such large amounts of money and becoming much more specific in what they want, BGYB has performed well.

Once you have decided on the type of charter that you wish to experience, the BGYB charter team will put all their efforts into finding the right yacht and the right destination.

(APA) which is 20% - 30% of the charter fee. This is given to the yacht captain prior to the charter to allow for provisioning of the yacht in preparation for the charter. At the end of the charter (and during if requested) the captain will produce full accounts of all expenditure either with a refund of monies not spent or a request for payment if the APA was exceeded.
